### 'Hamlet' at the CAC

#### By LUCI de HAAN

More than just another 'interpretation,' Vance Holmes' 'The Naked Hamlet,' performed last week at the CAC was an experiment in the bizarre.

Theatergoers set for the usual Shakespearean fare may have been surprised, but few in attendance seemed disappointed.

From the opening chase scene to the riotous 'Russian roulette' finale, the audience is kept off balance by a skilled mixture of the absurd and the sublime. The costume and props are all contemporary. The language is a mixture of Shakespeare at his best with a heavy helping of twentieth century slang thrown in. Women play the parts of men and vice versa.

Coupled with these factors was an outstanding cast, especially J. Preston Mendenhall as Hamlet, Matthew Daugherty as Gertrude and Vanessa Lise Shaffer as Ophelia. All the actors in the play were colorful (as was the play visually) and they really seemed to be enjoying themselves on stage.

Consequently, the audience enjoyed them.

And through the play's absurdity and humor there was a truth. For in a play in the caliber of 'Hamlet,' the symbolism is so apparent tha no matter what you do to it, no matter how you change the form and language, the intergrity of the symbolism is not lost. This is most apparent in the finale when Hamlet and Claudius, actually holding a script on stage, read their fate, showing the powerlessness of man in its naked form.

As Vance Holmes pointed out:
"A masterpiece is powerful and can withstand these shocks to which it is submitted."













First of all, were missing ALL MY CHILDREN for this...so it better be good. (It's the small things we'll remember when we leave here, I am told!)
